




07/03/25 SAFETY DAY:

11/03/25 Grade-1 Activity on Transport :

22/03/25 Rainy Day Activity Grade-1:

26/03/25 Science Activity by Grade-7:

- **Aim:** To distinguish fresh egg or rotten egg
- **Materials Required:** Two eggs, transparent container and water
- **Learning outcomes:**
 1. Students will be able to apply observation and inquiry skills to differentiate between fresh egg and rotten egg using this floating activity.
 2. Students will apply knowledge about the characteristics of fresh and rotten eggs by smell, weight and floatation.
 3. Students will develop an understanding of the health implications of consuming spoiled eggs and how to safely dispose them.



Science Activity –Grade 2:

The students of Grade 2 actively participated in an exciting and educational activity on the topic "**Food We Eat.**" The activity aimed to enhance their understanding of different types of food, their sources, and their importance in maintaining a healthy lifestyle.

The students were divided into groups and engaged in various hands-on tasks such as sorting food items into categories (fruits, vegetables, grains, dairy, and proteins), identifying healthy and unhealthy foods, and discussing balanced
